Adopt-A-River Volunteer

Job Description

Volunteers for the Adopt-A-River (AAR) program paddle (kayak or canoe)either the Platte or CrystalRiverat least a couple of times from June through September and reporting findings on the Friends web site: www.friendsofsleepingbear.org.

Volunteers will be provided with training and a free annual pass to Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore.

The duties of the Adopt-A-RiverVolunteer include:

- Attend at least one group River Clean-up and paddle your "adopted" river or park water body at least a couple more times during the summer.
- Model safety for the waterborne park visitors. That includes wearing a Personal Floatation Device (PFD).
- Increase visibility by wearing your NPS Ambassador vest (obtained at the training session) over your PFD.
- Periodically pick up litter from river bottom, edges, and parking areas and deposit this in bags in or near NPS garbage containers.
- Provide assistance to Park visitors if requested.
- Report your volunteer hours and any maintenance or safety issues on Friends web site www.friendsofsleepingbear.org after each paddle.

Required Experience

- Ability to paddle the Crystal River or Platte River.
- You must have your own boat, PFD, and other safety equipment.
- Access to the Friends web site to make reports after your river patrol.

Required Training

Annual training (done in June or at the scheduled river clean-up events) is provided by the Friends of Sleeping Bear Dunes, Sleeping Bear Dunes.

Time Commitment

2-4 hours per paddle depending on the section of river or water bodies you paddle.
