## **SBHT Ambassador Coordinator**

# **Job Description**

The Sleeping Bear Heritage Trail (SBHT) is a proposed 27-mile long non-motorized trail for biking, hiking, running, walking, wheelchair use, and cross-country skiing. To date, 22 miles of trail have been built. Trail Ambassadors walk, ski, or ride bikes on the trail to be available to monitor the condition of the trail, answer visitor questions, lend assistance, and do minor trail maintenance. Ambassadors enter their trail reports on the data-reporting page of our web site: www.friendsofsleepingbear.org.

The SBHT Ambassador Coordinator duties include:

- Provide training and materials for the Ambassadors and participate in an annual SBHT Ambassador training meeting in May or June. Training includes describing the duties of the Ambassador, safety, how to interact with trail users, and reporting requirements. Much of this content is provided by Park Rangers.
- Provide one-on-one training for new volunteers who were not able to attend the annual training meeting.
- Ensure that all new SBHT Ambassadors sign up to be NPS volunteers. Original
  applications are scanned or copied and sent to the Friends Membership Director,
  so their contact information can be entered into the Friends Membership
  database. Originals of the forms are given to the Park Volunteer Coordinator.
- Monitor all Ambassador Reports and forward reports of any major maintenance or safety issues to the SBHT Trail Crew Manager for resolution.
- Report to the Friends Programs Director, who will submit the report for the information packet for the Executive Committee or Board of Directors meetings.
- Find Ambassadors to volunteer to work on special events held on the SBHT.

## Required Experience

#### **Required Training**

Website, database and spreadsheet training provided by Friends of Sleeping Bear Dunes.

#### **Time Commitment**

2-4 hours per week in the High Season (May – September) to coordinate.

Preparation for the Annual kick-off and training meeting in May or June requires about 12 hours.

If the SBHT Coordinator is also an Ambassador (recommended), add another 4 hrs per month.
